During the last ESAO Board Meeting - held at the Venice Airport on 6 March - amongst other topics discussed, the main issue was the agreement and signing of the new contract with Wichtig Editore. This was confirmed when all those who were present agreed on the future of the journal which has now become the official journal of our Society. Other innovations including the future electronic submission of papers to the journal is under consideration. This will speed up the peer-review process of manuscripts and decrease the average number of days from manuscript receipt to publication.

ESAO Winter School

The 3rd ESAO Winter School was held in Cortina d'Ampezzo, Italy, from 6-8 March and organised by Dieter Falkenhagen, Joerg Vienken and Beat Walpoth, together with Professor Giuseppe Faggian from the Verona University. The title of this year's meeting was "Inflammation and Artificial Organs". During this one and a half-day Winter School there were 16 talks given

by European and International speakers relating to the main title and covering topics such as *Inflammatory Cascade, Pathophysiology of Inflammation, Clinical Aspects of Inflammation, SIRS-Sepsis and Therapies for inflammation*. A short oral presentation from a selected abstract was given at the end of each of the above topics. The meeting was very much appreciated by all those attending and a special issue of our journal will be devoted to the publications of the talks.

ESAO Annual Congress

The 35th Annual Congress of our Society will take place in Geneva, Switzerland, from Wednesday, 3 to Saturday, 6 September and will be entitled "*Towards future biomedical technologies*". Over 330 abstracts have been received from more than 35 countries and the program of the meeting will be published in the International Journal of Artificial Organs. It will be available also on our congress website at the beginning of June: <http://www.esao2008.medecine.unige.ch/> Plenary sessions will address organ support, transplantation and the new technologies related to heart, liver and kidney. Besides this, there will be a very attractive social program. As President of the Society and organiser of this year's congress, I look forward to a highly interesting and provocative program and to seeing you in Geneva.
